## REMOTE SURETY PROCESS – GUIDE FOR SURETIES

The COVID-19 Omnibus (Emergency Measures) (Criminal Proceedings and Other Matters) Regulations 2020 ('the COVID Regulations') came into force on June 2, 2020.

These Regulations modify the application of various provisions of a number of Acts.

An important modification is to the process of entering surety to bail.

This guide is designed to assist a surety to <u>remotely sign the undertaking of bail</u> and the <u>affidavit of justification by surety</u>. The Magistrates' Court of Victoria will manage this process as follows:

- 1. On the day bail is granted with a surety, you must attend at a Magistrates' Court with surety funds/documents and identification. This court can be a different court to the one that bailed the accused provided it is equipped with audio visual facilities;
- 2. If all other bail conditions can be satisfied, and you have with you the relevant documents or funds which can include:
  - a. cash;
  - b. bank-cheque;
  - c. original Certificate of Title (if the property is unencumbered);
  - d. mortgage statement, council rates notice and/or utility bills (if the property is subject to a mortgage); and
  - e. any other relevant documents

the registrar will attempt to book a link with the relevant custodial facility to enable bail to be entered remotely.

- 3. It should be noted that links may not be available immediately after the hearing. There may be a delay.
- 4. You will be required to remain at that court until an audio visual link is established with the authorised officer who will be entering the accused on bail.
- 5. If there is a delay in being able to establish a link, you may choose to attend at the relevant custodial facility to have the bail processed.
