Understanding this Notice

You have received this notice because the applicant wants to withdraw the application for personal safety intervention order.

This notice tells you

- the applicant is seeking to withdraw the application for intervention order
- why they want to withdraw the application
- when the matter is listed before the Court (the hearing date)

This notice does not mean the application for intervention order has been withdrawn.

A presiding Judicial Officer must decide and order an application to be withdrawn. The Judicial Officer will consider the withdrawal at a hearing – details are on page 1 of this notice.

The court recommends you appear at the hearing – this is where the Judicial Officer may order that the application be withdrawn and will explain their decision.

Any interim intervention order will continue until the Court orders the application be withdrawn.

You can contact the court if you have questions about this notice or the hearing.
