What happens when you visit our website?



Our website is mcv.vic.gov.au.



We can see data about how you use our website every time you visit.




For example, we can see

what time you visit




• what pages you click on



• how long you stay on each page



what you search for



what you download.

Download means you save a document from the internet onto your computer.



When you visit our website we can see if you use

a computer

or



a smartphone.



We can see from what country you visit our website.




We can see what program you use to get on the internet.

For example, Google Chrome.



We can also see how you found our website on the internet.




We **never** know who you are if you just click around on our website.

Why do we collect website data?

We want to make sure our website is good.



We collect website data to understand

how many people visit our website each day



what people like to read



• if it is easy to find information



• if we need to make changes.



We also use the data we get to make our website safe against **hackers**.

Hackers are people who try to steal information from computers.

Who can see your website data?



We use a Google program to see what people do on our website.



The only people who can see this data are

Google

and



• us.



Other people can only see you website data if

you tell us it is ok

or




• the law says we must.



For example, sometimes we must share information with the police.

Can you stop the website data?



We use **cookies** on our website.

Cookies are small tools that collect data.



We put the cookies on your computer for the short time you are on the internet.





When you stop using the internet the cookies go away.



You can choose to stop some cookies.

Go to our website to choose the cookies you want to stop.

If you stop some cookies



Our website might have problems if you choose to stop some cookies.



For example, you might not be able to

see all information



• see all images



• find what you need.



Contact us if you need help to find information on our website.

Can we see personal information about you?



Personal information means things like

• your name



your address



your birthday.



We can only see personal information about you if you give it to us.



For example

• if you fill in a form




• if you send us an email



 you write your postcode in the search box on our website.

What we must do



We must keep your information safe.



We must make sure **nobody** can change the information you give us.



We make sure **nobody** can steal your information.



We must **not** give your information to marketing companies.



If we need to talk to other people about your information we must ask you first.



The law says sometimes we must share your information even if you say **no**.

For example, if the police tells us to.
